

REGULAR MEETING
TOWN OF DAYTON
WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 12, 2016
7:00 P.M.

- PRESENT: Mark Smith, Supervisor, Dennis Ackley, Diana Clabeaux, Thomas Chupa, Town Council, Ruth Bennett, Town Clerk, Brian Taber, Highway Superintendent, James Musacchio, Attorney, Ada & Bob Fisher, Sylvia & Glen Morey, Gene & Erwin Morey, Norman Kwaizer, Aaron & Duane Foster, Joshua Markham, Dan Stang, Absent: Edward Lulas
- CALL TO ORDER: Supervisor Smith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- MINUTES: Clerk Bennett gave each member of the Board a copy of the minutes to be read before the meeting. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Councilman Chupa, seconded by Councilman Clabeaux. A vote was taken on the motion, Carried.
- HIGHWAY: The Highway Department reported they did some more blacktop patching, put some gravel on one of the gravel roads, hauled sand to mix with salt for the upcoming season, we are trying something different this year, we covered the pile of salt hoping it will help. We also fixed some washouts, changed a cross pipe on Jolls Road that the Board requested and also changed another one that had rotted out.
- COURT: Court Clerk Bennett reported the Court heard in September – 23 Vehicle & Traffic, 5 Town Law, 3 Penal Law, 1 Small Claim, 1 ECL case a total of 33 cases and collected \$2,499.00.
- CLERK: Clerk Bennett read the Association of Towns is having a school of management in Rochester on Nov. 14, 2016 and in Albany on Nov. 18, 2016.
- Also got and email from Verizon about the long distance service Board decided to table for more information.
- BILLS: A motion was made by Councilman Ackley, seconded by Councilman Chupa to pay General Funds claims #170-186, in the amount of \$5,896.37 as set forth in Abstract #10, dated October 12, 2016, Highway Fund claims #108-119, in the amount of \$22,391.64 as set forth in Abstract #10, dated October 12, 2016. A vote taken on the motion, Carried.
- SUPERVISOR: Supervisor Smith asked the Highway Superintendent to put up a hitching rail for the Amish to tie their horses to.
- Supervisor Smith read the South Dayton Ambulance agreement. A motion was made by Councilman Clabeau, seconded by Councilman Chupa to accept the agreement, A vote was taken on the motion, Carried.
- Discussed extending the moratorium on the commercial solar farms for another six months if we don't have a law that is consistent with other Towns to put in place before this six months are up.
- PUBLIC: Norm Kwaizer, 9248 VanEtten Road wanted to know why his assessment went so high when the house he is building is in process, he has no occupancy yet, what recourse do I have?
- Bob Fisher who lives on the Perrysburg side of Townline Road was told that a letter has been sent to Mr. Washy about the junk and given time to do something about it.
- Erwin & Gene Morey, Cottage Road wanted to know why the assessment on his

property was raised considerable—she never did her job.

Sylvia Morey & Glen Morey, Cottage Road stated the assessor was very unprofessional telling us about her personal problems. We asked her to come and look at our land which she did on Monday, when can we expect to hear something from her? Why didn't we ever receive any notice that this was being done?

Josh Markham, Markham-Wesley Road questioned why his assessment doubled.

Dan Stang, Maltbie Road met with Roxanne and it was like talking to a wall, would like to know why my assessment was doubled.

Aaron Foster, Jolls Road asked by his assessment doubled. Duane Foster came to observe.

Supervisor Smith said he would come on Sat. Oct. 15, 2016 and talk to the assessor about these questions and get back to each one.

The Supervisor, Town Clerk and Tax Collector's reports for September, 2016 were received by the Board.
