

REGULAR MEETING
TOWN OF DAYTON
WEDNESDAY, MARCH 13, 2019

- CALL TO ORDER:** Supervisor Mardino-Miller called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. All stood and said the Pledge to the Flag.
- MINUTES:** Clerk Bennett gave each member of the Board a copy of the minutes to be read before the meeting. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Councilman Chupa, seconded by Councilman Ackley. A vote was taken on the motion, Carried.
- HIGHWAY:** The Highway Department plowed and sanded the roads ten days during the month, hauled sand to mix with salt to get us by for this season, cutting brush along Town roads and had to replace fuse block in truck #7 as it shorted out.
- The loader is being repaired, it was transported to Buffalo by the County as part of our shared services agreement.
- CLERK:** Clerk Bennett reported the Court heard 11 Vehicle and Traffic, 5 Town Ordinance, 3 General Maintenance Law for a total of 19 cases and collected \$628.00.
- Read a letter of resignation from Richard Tabak due to change of residence.
- Southern Tier West is presenting the Local Government Conference on Thursday, May 9, 2019 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- TAX COLLECTOR:** January Collections were \$954,821.69, February Collections were \$91,584.64, total collections so far \$1,046,406.33, paid to Supervisor \$442,786.50, paid to the County \$282,608.54, had a corrections of errors from previous assessor Roxanne Aucoin \$518.82.
- ASSESSOR:** The 2019 exemption deadline was March 1st. Three Enhanced STAR applicants failed to submit any information or contact our office so they were switched back to Basic STAR. There were nine new applicants.
- Three Agricultural Assessment applicants failed to submit any information or contact our office with renewal information, five new Agricultural Assessment applications were filed.
- Six new Alternate Veterans Exemptions were filed.
- Corresponded with several property owners about their assessments, tax bills, and exemptions. Added six property transfers.
- CODE ENFORCEMENT:** CEO reported he issued one permit and has three or four in the planning stages. Sent out a couple more letters about property maintenance.
- I have been contacted about larger solar systems, the chapter designating a Zone we do not have, which is Residential/Agriculture, which we to amend before I can go ahead with answering the request I have received.
- BILLS:** A motion was made by Councilman Drajem, seconded by Councilman Chupa to pay General Funds claims #29-43 in the amount of \$3,490.59 as set forth in Abstract #3, dated March 13, 2019, Highway Fund claims #19-28, in the amount of \$4,481.60 as set forth in Abstract #3 dated March 13, 2019. A vote was

taken on the motion, Carried.

SUPERVISOR: The Supervisor updated the Board on the cable process. On March 22, 2019 ask the Public Service Commission for a waiver, by April 1st be put on the Public Service Commission agenda and if things go to plan they will pass it on May 16th. The cable company is getting pole numbers to request of those companies to allow them to use the poles.

A motion was made by Councilman Chupa, seconded by Councilman Clabeaux to run an advertisement for a highway employee. A vote was taken on the motion, Carried.

ATTORNEY: Attorney Grennell informed the Board that the Town had received a notice of claim for an incident that happened at Pine Valley School. The insurance company has been notified.

The Town Clerk report for February, 2019 was received by the Board.

ADJOURN: A motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Chupa, seconded by Councilman Clabeaux, at 7:23 p.m., Carried. The next meeting will be April 10, 2019 at 7 p.m
